Program Description

The University of Florida Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery program located in Gainesville is a single six-year residency/M.D. program which accepts two candidates per year. The program is fully accredited by the American Dental Association's Council on Dental Education and follows the guidelines of the American Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons. Training involves the full range and scope of the specialty, including facial trauma, orthognathic surgery, temporomandibular joint surgery, preprosthetic surgery, dental implants, facial aesthetic surgery, reconstructive surgery, microneurosurgery, head and neck oncology and craniofacial surgery.

All residents are eligible to sit for the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery examination after successfully completing the program.

The program includes 30 months of oral and maxillofacial surgery in Gainesville. In addition there are three years of medical school at the University of Florida and one year of general surgery residency.

Applicants are not required to take the MCAT or MSKP.

All program applicants must apply through PASS (Postdoctoral Application Support Service), which is sponsored by the American Association of Dental Schools. PASS is an application clearinghouse that provides uniform information to participating programs while relieving applicants of the burden of completing multiple individual applications. Participation in the PASS program is mandatory.

Additionally, our residency program participates in the Postdoctoral Dental Matching Program. This program provides a computerized service that matches preferred applicants to their desired program. Participation in this service is also mandatory by contractual agreement.

The oral and maxillofacial surgery residency/M.D. program is structured as follows:

Stipends are paid for all six years of the program, including the three years of medical school, and are determined on a yearly basis.

Medical school tuition is required for the three years of medical school. **As of 2007, non-Florida residents will receive a \$15,000.00 tuition waiver for the first year of medical school. By the second year of medical school, non-Florida residents will be expected to have established Florida residency and qualify for the even lower Florida resident tuition rates.**
