


A quick overview of ISIS services reveals that there are four distinct areas providing information. Admission Services, Financial Aid Services, Financial Services and Registrar Services. INCISOR staff reviewed each of the service sites and has pinpointed information most relevant to dental students. 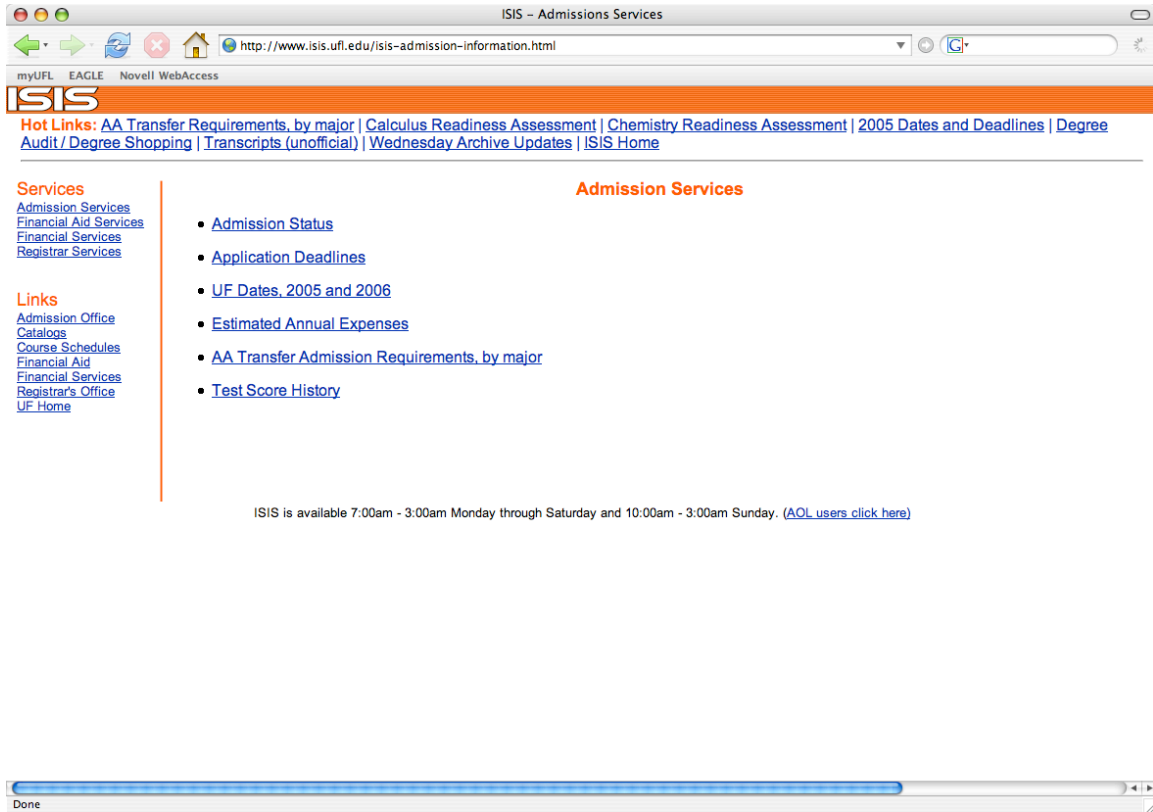

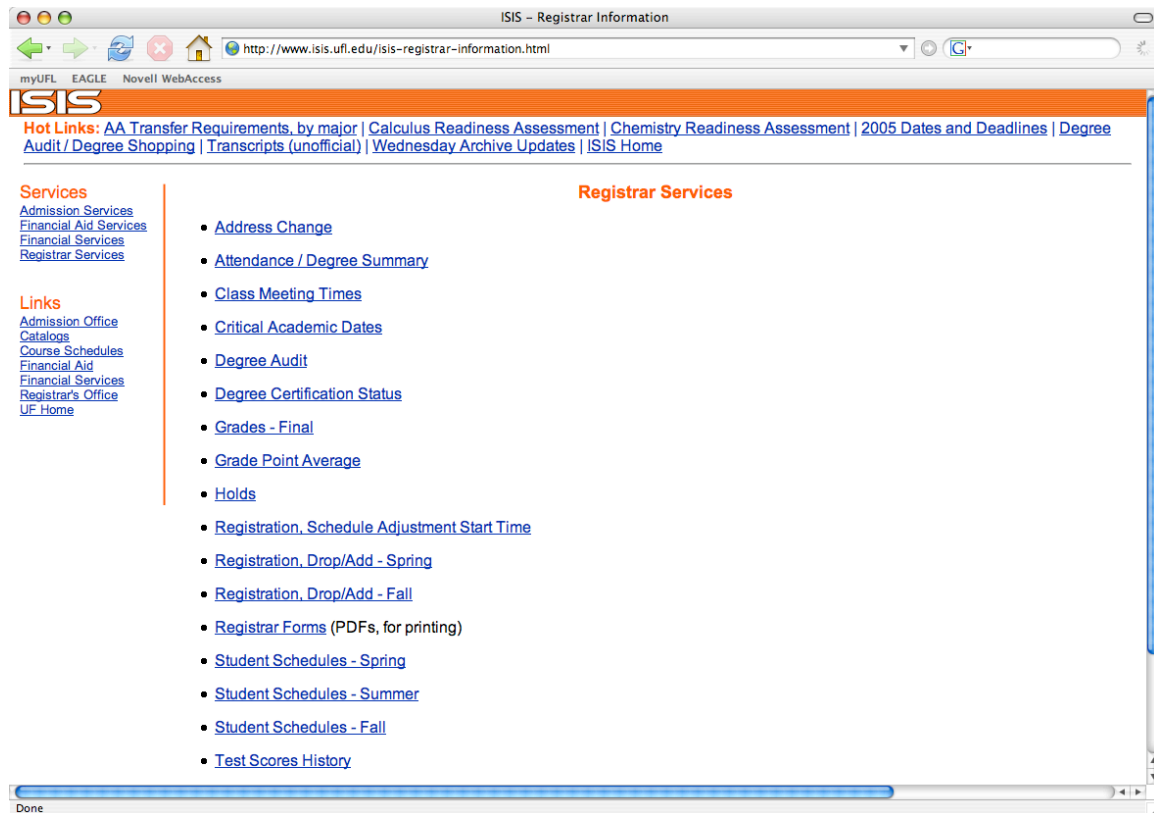

Once admitted, you probably will not have much need to refer to the Admissions Services screen on ISIS. However, a snapshot of Admissions Services reveals one item that may peak your interest.



If you ever want to know just how UF comes up with your tuition costs, check the [Estimated Annual Expenses](#) link. Follow the link to Professional Student Fees and you will find a complete breakdown of dental tuition. Checking this site each September will give you the cost of tuition for the entire year.

As evidenced by the snapshot below, the Registrar Services menu offers a plethora of options for students to choose.

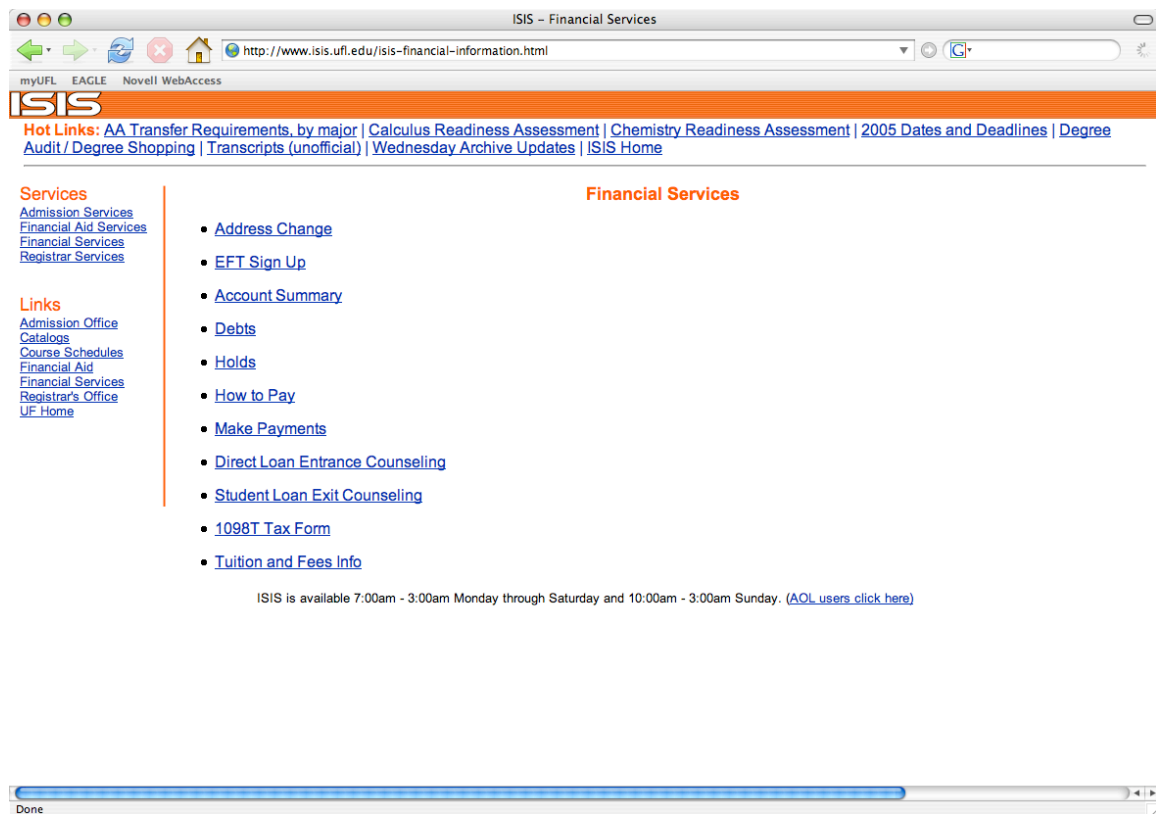


Although there are many screens to choose, dental students are encouraged to view a couple of these screens periodically. INCISOR staff recommends the screens listed below.

Address Change- allows you to view and change local and permanent addresses, phone numbers and email addresses.

Holds- if you are wondering why you are unable to access your grades, transcripts or other vital school information, it may be that you have a hold. Check this screen to determine which office is currently requesting that you pay them a visit.

The last two ISIS services screens hold the majority of the information that dental students will want to view on a regular basis. You will want to visit many of these sites several times during the academic year. As you can see from the graphic below, the Financial Services menu offers a number of intriguing options.



The following is a brief overview of links listed above that INCISOR staff has deemed highly important for dental students to view at least once a semester.

Address Change- also available under Registrar Services. Check your address at least once a semester to make sure that it reflects current personal information.

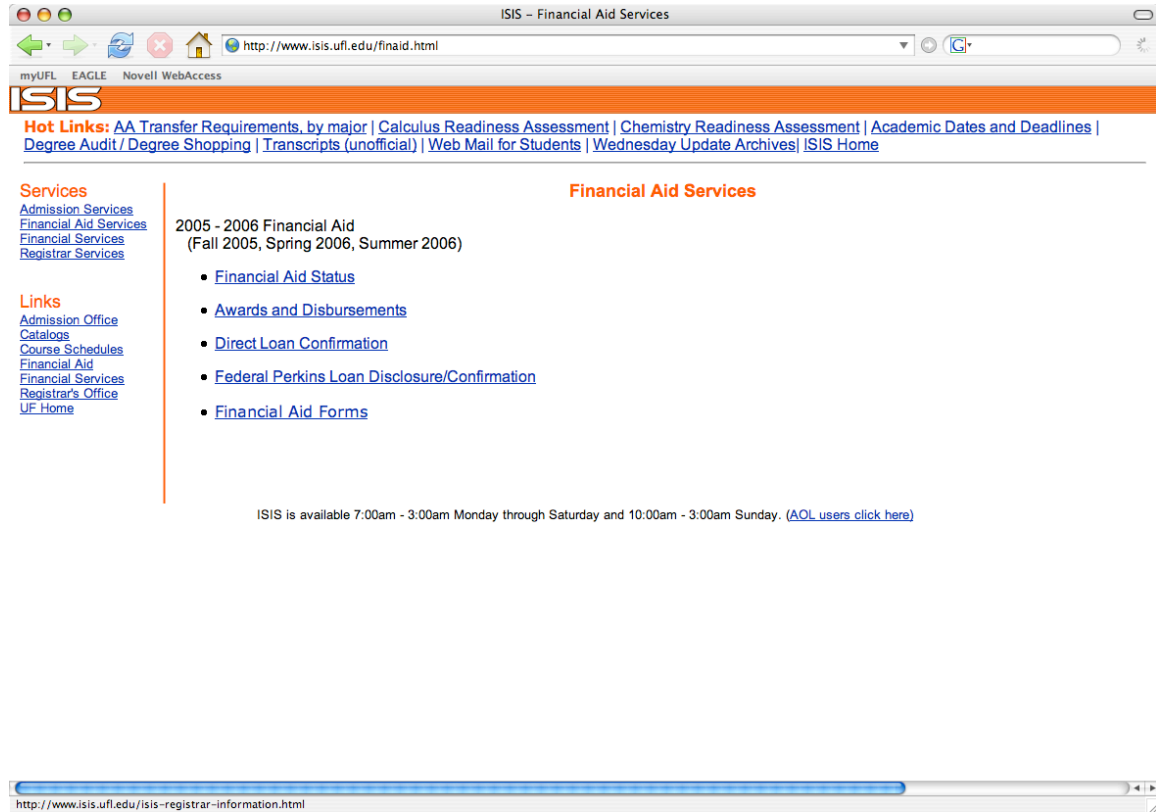
EFT Sign UP- INCISOR staff views this one as a biggie. Also known as Direct Deposit, signing up for this feature will allow the university to deposit financial aid funds directly into your checking account. If you are not signed up for EFT, your financial aid checks will be mailed to you. Of course with mailing there is always the chance that the check gets to you slower or worse, gets lost in the mail! Avoid delays with your financial aid by signing up for EFT today.

Debts and Holds- These two screens house information about any money owed to the university as well as holds that may be keeping you from viewing grades or getting registered. INCISOR staff believes that it is good practice to check these two sites once or twice per semester to make sure that your records mirror information in the university system.

How to Pay and Make Payments- This is a five star site if you owe tuition, instruments, books or anything school related that is not being deducted by financial aid. Many students utilize this site once per semester to pay any outstanding debts owed to the university.

Direct Loan Entrance Counseling and Student Loan Exit Counseling- Under normal circumstances both of these sites are visited only once. DLEC is done prior to taking out a Federal Direct Stafford Loan. Unless you sit out more than a semester or two, entrance counseling is only done once. SLEC must be done prior to graduation. Once again, unless you are sitting out for a semester, you should only need exit counseling once.

Near and dear to the hearts of all INCISOR staff, the Financial Aid Services screen is chock full of information regarding the money you will need to cover school expenses.



The Financial Aid Services screen allows you to:

Check your Financial Aid Status- this is a great screen to check prior to the start of each fall semester. In fact, you should start checking this screen roughly one month after submitting your FAFSA. You can view, and in most cases download to submit, outstanding documents being requested by the Office for Financial Affairs.

View Awards and Disbursements- this screen will allow you to view all money awarded to you for the upcoming semester. This screen has also been designed to let you know if and when your awards have been disbursed.

Most of you have probably already become accustomed to visiting the Direct Loan Confirmation page on a regular basis. As a dental student, if you rely on financial aid, you go to this site at least twice a year to confirm loans. If you have submitted a FAFSA prior to fall semester, you can confirm fall and spring loans in early August. Summer financial aid, which is awarded in late March, can be confirmed in early April.
