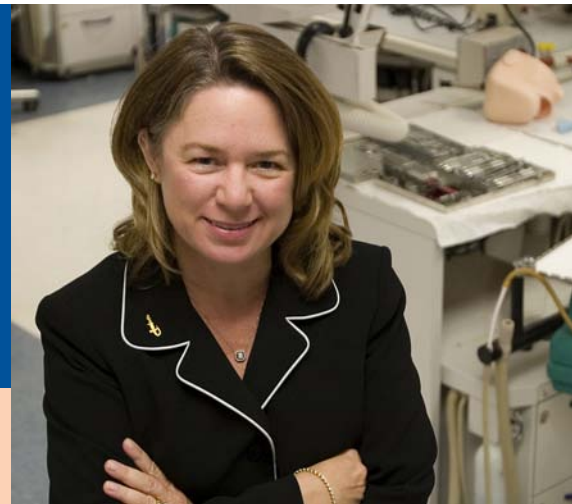

Education

The University of Florida College of Dentistry — one of six colleges at the UF Health Science Center — is dedicated to high-quality programs of education, research, patient care and public service. The class of 2011 scored an average of 85.35 compared with a national average of 80.70 on the 2009 National Board Dental Examination – Part I. The mean score for the National Board of Dental Examination – Part II for the class of 2009 was 81.55 compared with 80.9 for the national average. Last year the college received more than 1,400 applications for 83 openings in the 2009 entering D.M.D. class.

Research

The College of Dentistry **Department of Oral Biology** rated **first** in the U.S. based on National Institutes of Health research funding among similar departments. The oral biology faculty includes national leaders in oral infectious diseases and immunology research. The college is **nationally recognized for its oral health research enterprise**, emphasizing infectious diseases in dentistry, bone biology, pain and neurosciences, and **translational research to improve clinical dental care**. The college participates in the national Dental Practitioners Research Network with NIH and the University of Alabama that involves dental professionals in oral health research networks. The **NIH awarded a five-year, \$5.3 million grant** to create a research center aimed at reducing disparities in head and neck cancer survival through prevention and early detection in low income, minority men. It is the first of its kind to focus on head and neck cancer in the Southeast.



Patient Care

The DMD students perform dental care in clinics, supervised by faculty, to a wide range of patients in a professional dental environment. Through the **Statewide Network for Community Oral Health**, the college is one of the largest providers of affordable and indigent dental services in Florida. The NCEF Pediatric Dental Clinic, in Naples on the Collier County campus of Edison College, opened in December 2008. The clinic, funded by gifts and matching state funds, **provides increased access to care for pediatric patients** and enlarges our pediatric dentistry residency program.
