Research

- Oral Biology Department rated first in the U.S. based on NIH research funding among similar departments. Oral biology faculty includes national leaders in oral infectious diseases and immunology research.
- College is nationally recognized for its oral health research enterprise, emphasizing infectious diseases in dentistry, bone biology, pain and neurosciences, and translational research to improve clinical dental care.
- College participates in the national Dental Practitioners Research Network with NIH/NIDCR and the University of Alabama that involves dental professionals in oral health research networks.
- The NIH awarded a five-year, \$5.3 million grant to create a research center aimed at reducing disparities in head and neck cancer survival through prevention and early detection in low income, minority men. It is the first of its kind to focus on head and neck cancer in the Southeast.

Education

- The UF College of Dentistry is the only state supported dental institution in Florida and completed 101,686 patient visits last year.
- The Class of 2009 scored an average of 84.80 compared to the national average of 82.00 on the 2007 National Board Dental Examination – Part I. The mean score for the National Board of Dental Examination – Part II for the Class of 2008 was 82.2 compared to 80.9 for the national average.
- Received more than 1,500 applications for 83 openings in the 2008 entering D.M.D. class.

Patient Care

- Through the Statewide Network for Community Oral Health, the college is one of the largest providers of affordable and indigent dental services in Florida.
- The NCEF Pediatric Dental Clinic, in Naples on the Collier County Campus of Edison College, opened in December 2008. The clinic, funded by gifts and matching state funds, provides increased access to care for pediatric patients and enlarges our pediatric dentistry residency program.
